 - √ 3rd year of Belshazzar's reign ... Circa 550 BC
 - √ ~12 years before the Great Feast of Belshazzar Daniel Chapter 5





- Scholars are uncertain if Daniel
 - √ Was physically in Shushan
 - King's Business
 - ✓ Spiritually transported to Shushan
 - ✓ What do you think?

Where in the world is Daniel?

- Shushan ... aka Susa
- ~220 miles east of Babylon
- ~150 miles north of Persian Gulf
- Was capital of Elam
- Southwestern Persia (Iran)
- Darius I built a 2-acre palace
 - ✓ Enlarged by Xerxes
 - √ Home of Esther
- Scripture References
 - √ Nehemiah 1:1
 - ✓ Esther 1:2-5: 2:3-5
- Citadel
 - √ Fortified fortress and palace complex



- Traditional burial place of Daniel
- In 1901
 - ✓ Discovered famous Code of Hammurabi

- Daniel sees the Ram standing beside the River Ulai
 - Ram has two horns
 - ✓ Two Horns were high Horns represent power, kings, kingdoms
 - ✓ One was higher than the other Unequal in height
 - ✓ Higher one came up last
 Did not rise simultaneously
 - Ram represents the Medo-Persian Empire
 - ✓ Similar to the 2nd beast of Daniel chapter 7 Bear raised up on one side
 - ✓ Cyrus the Great
 - 1st galvanized the Persians initially smaller than the Medes
 - Then united the Medes into a single kingdom
 - » Father was Persian Cambyses I
 - » Mother was a Mede Mandane
 - Eventually the Persian portion of Kingdom dominated



 - No animal could withstand him

 - ✓ Alexander the Great





Alexander III of Macedon

- (20/21 July 356 10/11 June 323 BC)
- Commonly known as Alexander the Great
- King of Macedon, a state in northern ancient Greece.
- Born in Pella in 356BC
- Tutored by Aristotle until the age of 16.
- By the age of thirty
 - ✓ Created one of the largest empires of the ancient world
 - Stretching from the Ionian Sea to the Himalayas.
- Considered one of history's most successful commanders.
 - ✓ He was undefeated in battle
 - ✓ His empire stretched from Greece to modern-day Pakistan.





Profile - Alexander the Great - from Wikipedia

- Alexander succeeded his father, Philip II of Macedon, to the throne in 336 BC after Philip was assassinated.
- Upon Philip's death
 - Alexander inherited a strong kingdom and an experienced army.
 - He had been awarded the generalship of Greece and used this authority to launch his father's military expansion plans.
- In 334 BC, he invaded the Achaemenid empire, ruled Asia Minor, and began a series of campaigns that lasted ten years.
 - Alexander broke the power of Persia in a series of decisive battles, most notably the battles of Issus and Gaugamela.
 - He subsequently overthrew the Persian King Darius
 III and conquered the entirety of the Persian Empire.
 - At that point, his empire stretched from the Adriatic Sea to the Indus River.





Profile - Alexander the Great - from Wikipedia

- In the years following his death, a series of civil wars tore his empire apart, resulting in several states ruled by the Diadochi, Alexander's surviving generals and heirs.
- Alexander's legacy includes the cultural diffusion his conquests engendered.
- He founded some twenty cities that bore his name, most notably Alexandria in Egypt.
 - Alexander's settlement of Greek colonists and the resulting spread of Greek culture in the east resulted in a new Hellenistic civilization, aspects of which were still evident in the traditions of the Byzantine Empire in the mid-15th century.
- Alexander became legendary as a classical hero in the mold of Achilles, and he features prominently in the history and myth of Greek and non-Greek cultures.
- He became the measure against which military leaders compared themselves, and military academies throughout the world still teach his tactics.





 - √ Furious power







 - Persian empire is conquered



 - Large horn
 - ✓ Alexander the Great
 - Broken
 - ✓ When he became strong
 - After conquering the know world in less than 11 years
 - ✓ Sudden death of Alexander the Great
 - Died of a fever in Babylon
 - Died at the age of 32
 - Within 15 months of his death
 - » His natural brother (Philip Aridoeus) was murdered
 - » His two sons (Alexander Aegus, Hercules) were murdered
 - ✓ His kingdom was divided in four

 - Four notable ones
 - ✓ Leaders who succeed Alexander
 - ✓ Alexander's Empire is divided into four pieces
 - Toward the four winds of heaven
 - ✓ Directions
 - Four points on a compass
 - Areas of dominion relative to Israel
 - √ Four winds could be translated spirits
 - Toward heaven or under heaven
 - Rising in power and authority

 - » Sovereignty of God









- Seeking to re-assert Macedonian power and Greek independence
 - Philip V's son Perseus incurred the wrath of the Romans
 - Resulting in the Third Macedonian War (171-168 BC).
 - Victorious, the Romans abolished the Macedonian kingdom
 - replacing it with four puppet republics
 - these lasted a further twenty years
 - before Macedon was formally annexed as a Roman province (146 BC).
- Having so firmly intricated themselves into Greek affairs the Romans now
 - Completely ignored the rapidly disintegrating Seleucid empire
 - Left the Ptolemaic kingdom to decline quietly
 - while acting as a protector of sorts, stop other powers taking Egypt over
 - including the famous line-in-the-sand incident
 - when the Seleucid Antiochus IV Epiphanes tried to invade Egypt
 - The end of Ptolemaic Egypt came
 - as the final act in the republican civil war between
 - Mark Anthony and Augustus Caesar.
 - After the defeat of Anthony at the Battle of Actium Augustus
 - Invaded Egypt and took it as his own personal fiefdom.
 - He thereby completed both the destruction of the Hellenistic kingdoms and the Roman republic, and ended (in hindsight) the Hellenistic era.

- The little horn
 - Out of one of them came the little horn
 - ✓ One of the four leaders that succeeded Alexander
 - ✓ Not the Little Horn of Daniel chapter 7
 - Antichrist
 - Rises from amount the Ten Horns
 - » End time kings
 - » Out of the final Kingdom (Revelation 13)
 - ✓ Little horn comes out of the Grecian Empire
 - From kingly lineage of Seleucus
 - » Antiochus IV Epiphanes
 - » "Old Testament Anti-Christ"
 - Type of the Final Antichrist
 - » The Little Horn of Revelation
 - Grew exceedingly great toward
 - ✓ South, East
 - ✓ Glorious Land Israel ... (Daniel 11:16; 11:41)



Daniel 8:10 - Observations



¹⁰ And it grew up to the host of heaven; and it cast down *some* of the host and *some* of the stars to the ground, and trampled them.

- Little horn grows to the host of heaven
 - Vision skips over the four horns and concentrates on the little horn
 - Little horn not only grows toward the south, the east and the glorious land but reaches upward toward the host heaven
 - The horn causes the stars to be thrown to the ground
 - The horn tramples the fallen stars
 - ✓ Represents that actions of Antiochus IV Epiphanes toward the Jews



Profile - Antiochus IV Epiphanes



- Antiochus IV Epiphanes (Mithradates or Mithridates before he ascended the throne)
 - 8th king of the Seleucid (Syrian) dynasty ... 175-163 BC
 - √ (1 Maccabees 1:10; 6:16)
 - Ascended to the throne
 - ✓ Following the murder of his brother (Seleucus Philopator)
 - ✓ Not the rightful heir
 - Rightful heir: Demetrius
 - » The son of Seleucus, alive, but held captive in Rome
 - Antiochus obtains the throne by
 - » Flattery, bribery, and Intrigue (Daniel 11:21)
 - Came to power in 175 BC
 - ✓ Invaded Egypt defeated Ptolemy VI (v. 9)
 - ✓ Recalled from Egypt by Rome
 - Made Jerusalem a buffer state
 - Plundered & desecrated the temple
 - He called himself "Epiphanes" the "Illustrious One"

Abomination of Desolation by Antiochus IV Epiphanes

"And the king sent letters by messengers to Jerusalem and the cities of Judah; he directed them:

- to follow customs strange to the land,
- to forbid burnt offerings and sacrifices and drink offerings in the sanctuary,
- to profane Sabbaths and feasts,
- to defile the sanctuary and the priests,
- to build altars in sacred precincts and shrines for idols,
- to sacrifice swine and unclean animals, and
- to leave their sons uncircumcised.

They were to make themselves abominable by everything unclean and profane, so that they should forget the law and change all the ordinances. And whoever does not obey the command of the king shall die."

--1 Maccabees 1:44-49

¹¹ He even exalted *himself* as high as the Prince of the host; and by him the daily *sacrifices* were taken away, and the place of His sanctuary was cast down.

- The little horn by his actions is defying God
 - His action include
 - ✓ Exalted himself as high as the Prince of the host
 - Who is the Prince of the Host?
 - Jesus
 - √ Takes away the daily sacrifices (Exodus 29:38-39)
 - One lamb was offered in the morning
 - One lamb was offered in the evening
 - √ Casts down God's sanctuary

³⁸ "Now this *is* what you shall offer on the altar: two lambs of the first year, day by day continually. ³⁹ One lamb you shall offer in the morning, and the other lamb you shall offer at twilight.

- Exodus 29:38-39... NKJV

Daniel 8:12 - Observations



¹² Because of transgression, an army was given over *to the horn* to oppose the daily *sacrifices;* and he cast truth down to the ground. He did *all this* and prospered.

- Judgment on the Jews who transgressed the law
 - Because of the transgressions of the Jews
 - ✓ Knowingly introducing pagan customs
 - ✓ Ignoring the prescription of the law
 - The horn is allowed
 - √ To oppose the daily sacrifices
 - ✓ Case truth down to the ground
 - √ To prosper
 - Only for a season
 - Be encouraged
 - » Our trials are only for a season

Daniel 8:13-14 - Observations



¹³ Then I heard a holy one speaking; and *another* holy one said to that certain *one* who was speaking, "How long *will* the vision *be, concerning* the daily *sacrifices* and the transgression of desolation, the giving of both the sanctuary and the host to be trampled underfoot?" ¹⁴ And he said to me, "For two thousand three hundred days; then the sanctuary shall be cleansed."

How long will the transgression last


- Daniel does not know the names of the holy angels speaking
- The question is asked.
 - √ How long will the daily sacrifice be suspended?
 - ✓ Answer:
 - 2300 days
 - Actually "Evening- Mornings" [1150 days 110 days short of 3 ½ years]
- There is an expiration date on the pompous acts of the little horn
 - ✓ Encourages his readers, years in advance, to persevere
 - God is still in control
 - God has placed an expiration data on the little horns actions
 - ✓ Encourages us today to persevere

Daniel 8:15 - Observations



¹⁵ Then it happened, when I, Daniel, had seen the vision and was seeking the meaning, that suddenly there stood before me one having the appearance of a man.

- Daniel's vision is complete
 - He is seeking the interpretation of the vision
 - Suddenly there is someone in front of him
 - ✓ Appearance of a man not a man but "the appearance of a man"
 - ✓ Some scholars believe that this is an appearance of Jesus
 - Pre-incarnate

Daniel 8:16 - Observations



¹⁶ And I heard a man's voice between *the banks of* the Ulai, who called, and said, "Gabriel, make this *man* understand the vision."

- Daniel hears the man addressing Gabriel the Angel of God
 - Tells Gabriel to "make this man understand the vision"
 - ✓ Answer to what Daniel was seeking (previous verse)
 - "Seeking the meaning of the vision"

Gabriel

- First mention in the Bible of an angel by name
- Scripture References
 - √ Daniel 9:21
 - ✓ Luke 1:19, 26

Zacharias

Mary

Gabriel

From the Hebrew name גבריאל Gavri'el) meaning **"strong** man of God".

Gabriel was one of the seven archangels in Hebrew tradition. He appears in both the Old Testament and the New Testament, where he serves as the announcer of the births of John to Zechariah and Jesus to Mary.

According to Islamic tradition he was the angel who dictated the Qur'an to Muhammad.

This name has been used occasionally in England since the 12th century. It was not common in the English-speaking world until the end of the 20th century.

¹⁸ Now, as he was speaking with me, I was in a deep sleep with my face to the ground; but he touched me, and stood me upright.

- Gabriel is addressing Daniel
 - Daniel is in a deep sleep with his face to the ground
 - ✓ Daniel apparently passed out
 - Gabriel touches Daniel
 - - Two interpretations are in view both valid
 - » Physical: Daniel stands to his feet after being face down on the ground
 - » Intellectual: Daniel is made to understand the vision "set him straight"

Daniel 8:19 - Observations



¹⁹ And he said, "Look, I am making known to you what shall happen in the latter time of the indignation; for at the appointed time the end *shall be.*

- Gabriel making known to Daniel
 - What will happen
 - ✓ Concerning the latter time of the indignation
 - At the appointed time
 - ✓ The end shall be

Adumbration: foreshadow, faint image or resemblance of

- Goes beyond fulfillment by Antiochus IV
 - ✓ Antiochus IV is an adumbration of the final "Little Horn" the antichrist.
 - Antichrist will come at the end of the "Times of the Gentiles"
- · How can we know this?
 - ✓ Jesus said so ... Matthew 24:15
 - Part of Olivet Discourse (Matthew 24-25)
 - Abomination of desolation
 - An idol in the holy of holies
 - Still future event foreshadowed by Antiochus IV

15 "Therefore when you see the 'abomination of desolation,' spoken of by Daniel the prophet, standing in the holy place" (whoever reads, let him understand), — Matthew 24:15... NKJV

The Great Tribulation

Daniel 8:20-21 - Observations



²⁰ The ram which you saw, having the two horns — they are the kings of Media and Persia. ²¹ And the male goat is the kingdom of Greece. The large horn that is between its eyes is the first king.

- Gabriel interprets the animals in the vision
 - Ram with two horns
 - ✓ Kings of Media and Persia
 - Goat with large single horn
 - √ Goat: Kingdom of Greece
 - ✓ Large Horn: first king
 - Alexander the Great



Daniel 8:22 - Observations



²² As for the **broken** *horn* and the four that stood up in its place, four kingdoms shall arise out of that nation, but not with its power.

Gabriel continues the interpretation

- Concentrates on the broken horn and the four horns that arose in its place
- Broken Horn:
 - ✓ Sudden death of Alexander the Great
 - ✓ Dies after conquering the world in less than 11 years
 - ✓ Dies at the age of 32/33




²² As for the broken *horn* and the four that stood up in its place, four kingdoms shall arise out of that nation, but not with its power.

- Gabriel continues the interpretation
 - Four Subsequent Horns: ... Daniel 8:8
 - ✓ Four kingdoms of diminished power

⁸ Therefore the male goat grew very great; but when he became strong, the large horn was broken, and in place of it four notable ones came up toward the four winds of heaven. -- Daniel 8:8

²³ "And in the latter time of their kingdom, When the transgressors have reached their fullness, A king shall arise, Having fierce features, Who understands sinister schemes.

- Gabriel defines the time of the final king
 - In the latter time of their kingdom
 - ✓ Fast forward to the final kingdom
 - When the transgressors have reached their fullness
 - ✓ Time of the Great Tribulation
 - King arises
 - ✓ With fierce features
 - ✓ Understands sinister schemes
 - The king referred to here is the final Antichrist
 - ✓ Not Antiochus IV

Daniel 8:24 - Observations



²⁴ His power shall be mighty, but not by his own power; He shall destroy fearfully, And shall prosper and thrive; He shall destroy the mighty, and *also* the holy people.

- The Antichrist will be mighty
 - Not by his own power
 - By whose power?
 - ✓ Antichrist will be empowered by Satan
 - Revelation 13:4
 - Revelation 12:7-9
 - He shall destroy
 - √ the mighty and the holy people
 - ✓ Revelation 13:7

⁷ It was granted to him to make war with the saints and to overcome them. And authority was given him over every tribe, tongue, and nation. ⁸ All who dwell on the earth will worship him, whose names have not been written in the Book of Life of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world.

- Revelation 13:7-8 ... NKJV

The Beast from the Sea

⁴ So they worshiped the **dragon** who gave authority to the beast; and they worshiped the beast, saying, "Who *is* like the beast? Who is able to make war with him?"

 - Jesus

- He shall be broken without human means
 - God himself will break the Antichrist
 - ✓ Revelation 19:19-21-
 - ✓ Antiochus IV as an adumbration
 - Horrible death by worms and ulcers
 - » On his way to Judea to take vengeance
 - » For the defeat of his army by the Maccabees
 - Vision of Chapter 2

¹⁹ And I saw the beast, the kings of the earth, and their armies, gathered together to make war against Him who sat on the horse and against His army.²⁰ Then the beast was captured, and with him the false prophet who worked signs in his presence, by which he deceived those who received the mark of the beast and those who worshiped his image. These two were cast alive into the lake of fire burning with brimstone. ²¹ And the rest were killed with the sword which proceeded from the mouth of Him who sat on the horse. And all the birds were filled with their flesh. – Revelation 19:19-21 ... NKJV

The Beast and His Armies Defeated

Daniel 8:26 - Observations



²⁶ "And the vision of the evenings and mornings Which was told is true; Therefore seal up the vision, For *it refers* to many days *in the future.*"

- Daniel is instructed by Gabriel to Seal up the vision
 - Why?
 - ✓ Because it refers to many days in the future
 - Not for Daniel to understand
 - ✓ More fully explained in the book of Revelation
 - John the beloved's vision

Daniel 8:27 - Observations



²⁷ And I, Daniel, fainted and was sick for days; afterward I arose and went about the king's business. I was astonished by the vision, but no one understood it.

- After being instructed to seal up the vision Daniel faints
 - Daniel faints and was sick for days
 - Afterwards he bounces back and goes about the King's business
 - Daniel is astonished by the vision
 - No one understood it
 - ✓ Implies that Daniel shared the vision and interpretation with others

Jerome – Early Church Leader

I was astonished at the vision, but none understood it.

He had heard of kings, but knew not their names; he foresaw the events, but not the time when they were to take place; thereupon he could only feel "astonished," and leave all with the omniscient God.
