THE WHOLE ARMOR OF GOD

EPHESIANS 6:10-18

¹⁰ Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. 11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, 15 and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; 16 above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. ¹⁷ And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; 18 praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints—

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

Who was the Author of Ephesians?

- Paul the Apostle (AD 5- AD 67)
 - Roman Name: Paul
 - Jewish Name: Saul of Tarsus
 - Tarsus capital city in Cilicia province (south-central Turkey)
 - Died in Rome
 - Not one of the 12 apostles
 - In the mid-30s to the mid-50s
 - Founded 7 churches in Asia Minor and Europe
 - Held Jewish & Roman citizenship

 - Authored 13-14 of 27 NT books



Who was the Author of Ephesians?

- Paul the Apostle (AD 5- AD 67)
 - Pharisee
 - Persecuted the early church.

³ "I am indeed a Jew, born in Tarsus of Cilicia, but brought up in this city at the feet of Gamaliel, taught according to the strictness of our fathers' law, and was zealous toward God as you all are today. 4 I persecuted this Way to the death, binding and delivering into prisons both men and women, ⁵ as also the high priest bears me witness, and all the council of the elders, from whom I also received letters to the brethren, and went to Damascus to bring in chains even those who were there to Jerusalem to be punished. --- Acts 22:3-5 ... NKJV





Paul's Conversion

- Journeying to Damascus at noon
- Paul is knocked off his high horse
 - Literally By a bright light
 - Jesus confronts him

⁶ "Now it happened, as I journeyed and came near Damascus at about noon, suddenly a great light from heaven shone around me. ⁷ And I fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to me, 'Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?' ⁸ So I answered, 'Who are You, Lord?' And He said to me, 'I am Jesus of Nazareth, whom you are persecuting.' --- Acts 22:6-8






Paul's Conversion


Paul's First Missionary Journey






Paul's Journey to Rome



- After his third missionary journey, Paul was arrested in the Temple in Jerusalem and was brought before the Sanhedrin who had him sent to Caesarea.
- Over the next two years Paul was brought before the governor Felix, the governor Festus, and King Agrippa II.
- After appealing to the emperor, Agrippa had Paul sent to Rome.

Paul Preaching in Ephesus





- Ephesus was the center of worship for the goddess Diana (Artemis).
- A large, famous temple was built for Diana and dedicated to her.






A statue of Diana (Artemis)




- The area was a major port city of the Roman Empire.
- Businesses made money by selling silver idols and souvenirs to visitors.
- When Paul went there to preach about Jesus, people listened, and many became Christians.
- Some sorcerers who turned to Jesus came together and burned their magic books (worth 50,000 pieces of silver).
- Local silversmiths began to worry that too many people would become Christians, which would hurt their business.





- The silversmiths and merchants started a riot against Paul and his coworkers.
- The silversmiths demanded a hearing in the theater. The city clerk put down the riot, and a church started in Ephesus (Acts 19:17-41).

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

Spiritual Warfare - Goddess Worship



- During Paul's time in Ephesus he is engaged in Spiritual Warfare.
 - Ephesians 6:10-18 is not an academic thesis
 - He is engaged in the battle (Acts 19).
- Paul experienced victory
 - Performed many "unusual" miracles (Acts 19:11)
 - His actions were viewed as a direct threat to the goddess Diana - which fueled the local economy
 - Evil spirit recognized Paul, Jesus
 - Not the Sceva brothers
 - Itinerant Jewish exorcists
 - · Attacks the brothers
 - Incident known to all in Ephesus
 - Fear fell on them
 - Jesus was magnified
 - Many who practiced magic
 - · Publically burned their books





Spiritual Warfare - Goddess Worship - Some History



- Greeks and Romans had a pantheon of masculine gods (fallen angels)
- In addition there were the male demigods (offspring of fallen angels)
 - Titans Nephilim ... Offspring of the fallen angels ... demons

Spiritual Warfare - Goddess Worship - Some History



- The Greeks and Romans did not worship their male (demi)gods directly, they built local temples for their celestial mates.
- These woman became the local patron deities.
- In the days of the Apostles, Diana was the most important.
- A couple of interesting goddesses
 - Roman Minerva [Greek Athena]
 - Roman Juno [Greek Hera]



Spiritual Warfare - Goddess Diana (Artemis)



- Diana, was the goddess of the hunt, the moon, fertility and being associated with wild animals, and having the ability to talk to and control animals.
- Dianic Wicca, a largely feminist form of the practice, is named for her.
- Diana was know to be the virgin goddess of childbirth and women.
- Diana was one of the 3 maiden goddesses, Diana Minerva and Vesta, who swore never to marry.
- Her twin brother was Apollo.



Spiritual Warfare - Goddess Minerva (Athena)



- The Romans worshipped Minerva, civic goddess of protection, who would bring great leadership and intelligence to the community.
- She is the goddess who assures that the citizens of a community retain their liberty.
- She is also known as a wisdom goddess - note the owl.
- Does this goddess look familiar?

She stands atop our Capitol building in Washington D.C.






Spiritual Warfare - Goddess Juno (Hera)



- The Roman goddess Juno is another "wisdom" goddess.
- Juno is associated with money and banking. Her temple-banks were the foundation of what would become a global banking complex.
- She was thought to bring warning to a community, if evil were to attack.
- On Rome's Capitoline Hill, a temple to Juno commemorated her protective powers. Called Juno Moneta, from the Latin moneo, "to warn," her name was gradually modified into our word for, "money".
