- ✓ What is evil in human civilization infects both great world leaders and ordinary people alike.

Preview

The great harlot who rides a scarlet beast appears. She is called "Babylon the great". But the details of her description clearly indicate she represents the city on "seven mountains"- that great city that "reigns over the kings of the earth." Together, Revelation 17 & 18 describe the fall of "Babylon" in detail.
