





The acronym **INRI**

(Latin: *Iēsus Nazarēnus, Rēx Iūdaeōrum*) represents the Latin inscription which in English reads as "Jesus the Nazarene, King of the Jews" and John 19:20 states that this was written in three languages—Hebrew, Latin, and Greek—during the crucifixion of Jesus.

The Greek version reads **INBI**, representing Ἰησοῦς ὁ Ναζωραῖος ὁ Βασιλεὺς τῶν Ἰουδαίων.

Event: Jesus Handed Over to Pilate



Event	Matthew	Mark	Luke	John
Jesus handed over to Pilate	27:1-2	15:1	22:66-71	-

Observations

- Verse 1
 - ✓ All the chief priest and elders
 - Not just a small contingency
 - Plotted to Kill Jesus
- Verse 2
 - √ Jesus offers no resistance
 - He should not have been bound
 - ✓ Delivered Him to Pontius Pilate
 - Why?
 - Because the scepter had departed from Judah

Scripture Text

27 When morning came, all the chief priests and elders of the people plotted against Jesus to put Him to death. ² And when they had bound Him, they led Him away and delivered Him to Pontius Pilate the governor.

15 Immediately, in the morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council; and they bound Jesus, led *Him* away, and delivered *Him* to Pilate. --- Mark 15:1 ... NKJV

Observations

- Verses 3-5
 - ✓ Judas attempts to return the money
 - 30 pieces of silver
 - Silver is always associated with blood in the scriptures
- Verses 6-7
 - ✓ Chief Priests took the money
 - Could not put it in the treasury
 - » It was blood money
 - ✓ Consult on how to use the money
 - Notice the order
 - » They took the money
 - Then determined how to use it

- Verse 7
 - ✓ Chief Priests had good accountants
 - Could not put the money in the treasury
 - » 30 pieces of silver was blood money
 - But they could pre-pay anticipated expenses
 - » Temple was responsible for strangers dying in the precinct
 - » Took the money to buy a potters field
- Verse 8
 - ✓ Field is call Field of Blood

 - ✓ Price
 - 30 pieces of silver
 - ✓ Location
 - The temple "house of the LORD"
 - √ Who ends up with the money
 - The Potter

Prophecy fulfilled with astonishing accuracy!

Scripture Text

12 Then I said to them, "If it is agreeable to you, give *me* my wages; and if not, refrain." So they weighed out for my wages thirty *pieces* of silver.

13 And the LORD said to me, "Throw it to the potter"—that princely price they set on me. So I took the thirty *pieces* of silver and threw them into the house of the LORD for the potter.

 - ✓ Prophecy of Jeremiah fulfilled
 - Wait a minute
 - » We just read from Zechariah
 - » Not Jeremiah
 - What's going on here?
 - » Jeremiah has a collection of scrolls that contained the Zechariah scroll

Jesus faces Pilate	27:11-14	15:1-5	23:1-5	18:28-38

Observations

- Verse 11-14
 - ✓ Pilate asks Jesus if He is the King of the Jews.
 - Jesus answers in the affirmative
 - » It is as you say
 - ✓ Pilate is observing Jesus as He is being accused by the chief priests and elders
 - Jesus answered nothing.
 - Jesus is in control.
 - Pilate marveled greatly
 - How would you have responded?
 - » Fight or flight?

Scripture Text

11 Now Jesus stood before the governor. And the governor asked Him, saying, "Are You the King of the Jews?"
Jesus said to him, "It is as you say." 12 And while He was being accused by the chief priests and elders, He answered nothing.

13 Then Pilate said to Him, "Do You not hear how many things they testify against You?" 14 But He answered him not one word, so that the governor marveled greatly.

Observations

- Verse 15-18
 - ✓ Custom for the Governor (Pilate) to release one prisoner at the feast
 - A gesture of good will from Rome
 - » Notice Pilate does not get to choose the prisoner in this custom
 - » It is the multitude (people) who choose ... They will choose Barabbas
 - Pilate attempts to use this custom to release Jesus
 - » Because he knew the Chief Priests and elders had handed Jesus over because of envy
 - » He attempts to have the multitude choose Jesus for release

Scripture Text

¹⁵ Now at the feast the governor was accustomed to releasing to the multitude one prisoner whom they wished. ¹⁶ And at that time they had a notorious prisoner called Barabbas. ¹⁷ Therefore, when they had gathered together, Pilate said to them, "Whom do you want me to release to you?  - Have nothing to do with that just
 Man ...
 - He should have listened to his wife.
 - ✓ Chief priests and elders persuade the multitude to ask for Barabbas
 - Persuade = bribe
 - ✓ Pilate gives the multitude a choice
 - Jesus or Barabbas
 - ✓ Bribed crowd asks
 - For Barabbas to be release
 - For Jesus to be destroyed (killed)

 - What evil has He done?
 - Crowd is increasingly agitated
 - ✓ Crowd would not listen to reason
 - Whipped into a state of hate
 - » By their leaders
 - » By their greed (bribe)
 - » Ultimately evil forces of Satan behind the scenes
 - ✓ Pilate tries to wash his hands of the situation literally
 - Innocent blood of a just Person

You & Me ... Our sins are to blame!

Event: The Soldiers Mock Jesus



Event	Matthew	Mark	Luke	John
The soldiers mock Jesus	27:27-31	15:16-19	-	-

Observations

- Verses 27-31
 - ✓ Jesus is now under the control of the Roman soldiers. They ..
 - Strip Him
 - Put a scarlet robe on Him
 - Twist a crown of thorns on His head
 - Put a reed in His right hand
 - Bowed the knee before Him saying
 - » "Hail, King of the Jews"
 - Spat on Him
 - Took the reed and struck Him on the head with it
 - Took off the robe
 - Put on His clothes
 - Lead Him away to be crucified

Scripture Text

²⁷ Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the Praetorium and gathered the whole garrison around Him. ²⁸ And they stripped Him and put a scarlet robe on Him. ²⁹ When they had twisted a crown of thorns, they put it on His head, and a reed in His right hand. And they bowed the knee before Him and mocked Him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!"30 Then they spat on Him, and took the reed and struck Him on the head. 31 And when they had mocked Him, they took the robe off Him, put His *own* clothes on Him, and led Him away to be crucified.



- The Praetorium, or Pretorium,
 - · Latin version of the Greek word pronounced prai-tor-ion.
 - The Romans originally used the term for a general's tent in an army camp,
 - Later it also referred to a military headquarters in a city where the Roman governor or procurator also often resided.
 - The Bible variously refers to the Praetorium as
 - √ the "common hall"
 - √ the "governor's house"
 - ✓ the "judgment hall"
 - √ "Pilate's house"
 - √ the "palace."

Event: The King on a Cross

The King on a Cross	27:32-44	15:20-32	23:26-43	19:16-24

Observations

- Verses 32-44
 - √ Jesus is on His way to be crucified
 - ✓ Simon the Cyrene is compelled to bear Jesus' cross
 - Compelled = forced
 - Cyrene, Libya Northern Africa



Scripture Text

32 Now as they came out, they found a man of Cyrene, Simon by name. Him they compelled to bear His cross. ³³ And when they had come to a place called Golgotha, that is to say, Place of a Skull, ³⁴ they gave Him sour wine mingled with gall to drink. But when He had tasted it, He would not drink. 35 Then they crucified Him, and divided His garments, casting lots, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet: "They divided My garments among them, And for My clothing they cast lots." ³⁶ Sitting down, they kept watch over Him there. 37 And they put up over His head the accusation written against Him: THIS IS JESUS THE KING OF THE JEWS.

Observations

- Verses 38-40
 - ✓ Those who passed by blasphemed Him, wagging their heads, saying
 - You who destroy the temple and build it in 3 days, save yourself!
 - If You are the Son of God, come down from the cross
- Verses 41-43
 - ✓ Leader of the Jews mocked Him
 - **If** He is the King of Israel ...
 - If He (God) will have Him (Jesus) ...
- Verse 44
 - ✓ Robbers reviled Him

Scripture Text

³⁸ Then two robbers were crucified with Him, one on the right and another on the left.

³⁹ And those who passed by blasphemed Him, wagging their heads ⁴⁰ and saying, "You who destroy the temple and build *it* in three days, save Yourself! If You are the **Son of God**, come down from the cross."

⁴¹ Likewise the chief priests also, mocking with the scribes and elders, said, ⁴² "He saved others; Himself He cannot save. If He is the King of Israel, let Him now come down from the cross, and we will believe Him. ⁴³ He trusted in God; let Him deliver Him now if He will have Him; for He said, 'I am the **Son of God**.""

44 Even the robbers who were crucified with Him reviled Him with the same thing.

- Verses 45-46
 - ✓ 6th hour until the 9th Darkness
 - 12 noon 3 pm
 - 1st watch starts at 6 pm Evening
 - 1st hour starts at 6 am Morning
 - ✓ At the 9th hour Jesus cries out loud
 - Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?
 - » My God, My God, why have you forsaken me?
 - Commonly reported this is in Aramaicit is not it is in Hebrew
 - » Only time Jesus ever referred to the Father as "God" (and not "Father")
 - » Why do you think this is?

Scripture Text

45 Now from the sixth hour until the ninth hour there was darkness over all the land. 46 And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?" that is, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?"

 - ✓ Read this Psalm in your private study
 - Envision Christ on the Cross
 - You will be blessed
 - ✓ For an additional blessing.
 - Read and study Isaiah 53
 - See the references to Jesus

 - » NT: On business documents /receipts

 - ✓ Who was the witnesses?
 - Mary Magdalene
 - The other Mary
 - Why 2?
 - » 2 witnesses required to confirm a fact.

Scripture Text

57 Now when evening had come, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who himself had also become a disciple of Jesus. 58 This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be given to him. 59 When Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, 60 and laid it in his new tomb which he had hewn out of the rock; and he rolled a large stone against the door of the tomb, and departed. 61 And Mary Magdalene was there, and the other Mary, sitting opposite the tomb.



 - Tell Pilate that Jesus had said He would rise from the grave 3 days after His death
 - » Notice these leaders understood what Jesus meant when He said He would rise from the grave
 - » Jesus' disciples were slow to understand what Jesus had meant
 - Ask Pilate to secure the tomb until the third day
 - » Feared Jesus' disciples would steal His body and claim resurrection

 - ✓ Notice Pilate does not sign-up to secure the tomb
 - It is the Jewish leaders' guards
 - Not Roman soldiers

Scripture Text

⁶⁵ Pilate said to them, "You have a guard; go your way, make *it* as secure as you know how." ⁶⁶ So they went and made the tomb secure, sealing the stone and setting the guard.
