- With some of the articles of the house of God
  - ✓ Not all the articles
  - ✓ These would be used by his grandson Belshazzar fall of Babylon
  - ✓ Into the treasure house of his god *emphasis for shame*
- Shinar
  - ✓ Region that include the city of Babylon e.g., So Cal & LA
  - ✓ Used interchangeably in Scripture
  - ✓ Site of the Tower of Babel (Genesis 11:1-9)
    - Kingdom of Nimrod (Genesis 10:9)

- King appointed ... delicacies ... wine
  - Captives treated well apart from the homesickness, shame of captivity
    - ✓ Delicacies to eat
    - ✓ Wine to drink
    - ✓ Learning from most advanced training center of the world at that time
      - Sounds like the life of a Graduate Student ©
  - Three years of training
    - ✓ Learning the ways of the Chaldeans
    - ✓ Purpose
      - Serve before the king
      - Take most brightest from captives to advance kingdom

## Yahweh and Hallelujah



#### YAH [Holman Bible Dictionary]

Shortened form of Yahweh, the Hebrew name for the God of the covenant. (Also God; I Am; Jehovah; Lord; YHWH).

#### YHWH [Holman Bible Dictionary]

God's name in Hebrew known by the technical term "Tetragrammaton" (Greek, meaning four letters), these are the four consonants which make up the divine name (Exodus 3:15; found more than 6,000 times in the Old Testament). The written Hebrew language did not include vowels, only the consonants were used; thus readers supplied the vowels as they read (this is true even today in Hebrew newspapers). Reverence for the divine name led to the practice of avoiding its use lest one run afoul of Commandments such as Exodus 20:7 or Leviticus 24:16. In time it was thought that the divine name was too holy to pronounce at all. Thus the practice arose of using the word Adonai: "Lord." Many translations of the Bible followed this practice. In most English translations YHWH is recognizable where the word LORD appears in all caps.

In the course of the centuries the actual pronunciation of YHWH was lost. In the Middle Ages Jewish scholars developed a system of symbols placed under and beside the onsonants to indicate the vowels. YHWH appeared with the vowels from "Adonai" as a device to remind them to say "Adonai" in their reading of the text. A latinized form of this was pronounced "Jehovah." but it was actually not a real word at all. From the study of the structure of the Hebrew language most scholars today believe that YHWH was probably pronounced Yahweh (Yah' weh).

#### hallelujah

1535, from Heb. hallalu-yah "praise Jehovah," from hallalu, pl. imper. of hallel "to praise" also "song of praise," from hillel "he praised," of imitative origin, with primary sense being "to trill." Second element is yah, shortened form of Yahweh, name of God. Replaced variant formation alleluia (12c.).



        - » Made request
        - » Request denied
      - Then to the steward under the chief of the eunuchs
        - » Proposed test
        - » Passed test

  - Why would partaking of the delicacies constitute defilement?
    - ✓ Some or all of the meats would not be Kosher
      - Wine Kosher for all Jews except Nazirites (Numbers 6:3)-
    - ✓ Some or all of the meats and wine would be offered to Babylonian gods

6 Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup> "Speak to the children of Israel, and say to them: 'When either a man or woman consecrates an offering to take the vow of a Nazirite, to separate himself to the LORD, <sup>3</sup> he shall separate himself from wine and *similar* drink; he shall drink neither vinegar made from wine nor vinegar made from *similar* drink; neither shall he drink any grape juice, nor eat fresh grapes or raisins. <sup>4</sup> All the days of his separation he shall eat nothing that is produced by the grapevine, from seed to skin.

      - Wine Kosher for all Jews except Nazirites (Numbers 6:3)
    - ✓ Some or all of the meats and wine would be offered to Babylonian gods
    - √ Forbidden in Psalm 141:4-

4 Do not incline my heart to any evil thing, To practice wicked works With men who work iniquity; And do not let me eat of their delicacies.



<sup>8</sup> But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank; therefore he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself.

- Daniel Purposed in His Heart
  - Why would partaking of the delicacies constitute defilement?
    - ✓ Some or all of the meats would not be Kosher
      - Wine Kosher for all Jews except Nazirites (Numbers 6:3)
    - ✓ Some or all of the meats and wine would be offered to Babylonian gods
    - ✓ Forbidden in Psalm 141:4
    - √ Forbidden in Proverbs 23:1-3-

23 When you sit down to eat with a ruler, Consider carefully what is before you;

2 And put a knife to your throat

If you are a man given to appetite.

3 Do not desire his delicacies,

For they are deceptive food.



9 Now God had brought Daniel into the favor and goodwill of the chief of the eunuchs.

- God had brought Daniel into the favor...
  - Again we see the hand of God shaping events
    - ✓ Our God is ...
      - Sovereign
      - Omnipotent
      - Omnipresent
      - All Knowing
      - All Loving
    - ✓ That is why Our God can be trusted to do what is best ... because
      - He does not answer to another
      - He is all powerful
      - He is always present
      - He knows everything
      - He demonstrated His love for us
        - » He died for our sins while we were still sinners

Need **ALL**These Attributes

- Legitimate Concern
  - Daniel's request could lead to Ashpenaz losing his head
    - ✓ Ashpenaz fears King Nebuchadnezzar and with good reason
    - ✓ Nebuchadnezzar was good at reducing head count ☺
  - Daniel's request is denied by Ashpenaz
    - ✓ So why in the previous verse does it make the point that Daniel found favor?
      - Response is not an outright denial .. Just a valid statement of fear
      - Later Daniel will make a similar request of the steward
      - Be granted and pass a test ... such that Ashpenaz does not lose his head
      - It seems logical to assume that Ashpenaz was not totally out of the loop during the testing.
      - What do you think?

### Daniel 1:11-13 - Observations



<sup>11</sup> So Daniel said to the steward whom the chief of the eunuchs had set over Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, <sup>12</sup> "Please test your servants for ten days, and let them give us vegetables to eat and water to drink. <sup>13</sup> Then let our appearance be examined before you, and the appearance of the young men who eat the portion of the king's delicacies; and as you see fit, *so* deal with your servants."

- Daniel Proposes a Test
  - Test is for Ten Days
    - ✓ Two food groups
      - Daniel and Friends to eat vegetables and water
      - Others to eat king's delicacies and wine
    - ✓ Examine at the end of 10 days
      - Ten is a number of completeness ... Ten fingers, Ten toes
      - Check appearances of those in the two groups
  - King James uses "pulse" instead of vegetables
    - ✓ Any vegetable grown from seeds

### The Number 10 - Some Biblical References



- The Holy Spirit descended on the apostles ten days after the Ascension of Jesus.
- The ten leprous heal by Jesus. (Luke 17:11)
- The ten pounds given at ten servants in the parable. (Luke 19;13)
- The ten horns of the Beast of the Revelation with the ten diadems on each of horns.
   (Revelation 13:1)
- The **ten** impotent powers against the love of God. (Romans 8:38)
- The ten vices that exclude from the kingdom of God. (1 Corinthians 6:10)
- The ten nations whose hostility towards Israel was constant. (Psalm 83:7-9)
- Boaz took ten witnesses to marry Ruth. (Ruth 4:2)
- God move back the shadow on the sundial of Ahaz ten degrees as a sign that He was going to deliver Hezekiah from his mortal sickness and the city where he was. (Isaiah 38:1-8)
- The **ten** plagues of Egypt sent by God by the intermediary of Moses, according to the Bible: (1) the water changed into blood (2) the frogs, 3) the lice (4) the flies (5) the plague on the animals (6) the epidemic of boils (7) the hail (8) the locusts, the (9) three darkness days, finally (10) the death of the firstborns in each Egyptian family (Exodus 7-11)
- The Ten Commandments of God given to Moses. (Exodus 20:1)
- The **ten** generations from Adam until Noah. (Genesis 5)




- <sup>14</sup> So he consented with them in this matter, and tested them ten days.

## Daniel 1:15-16 - Observations



<sup>15</sup> And at the end of ten days their features appeared better and fatter in flesh than all the young men who ate the portion of the king's delicacies. <sup>16</sup> Thus the steward took away their portion of delicacies and the wine that they were to drink, and gave them vegetables

#### Test Results

- After ten days testing is completed
- Both groups of young men are examined
  - ✓ Daniel and Friends features appeared more health
    - Vegetable and water group deemed better than
    - Delicacies and wine group
- Based on the results
  - ✓ Steward takes away delicacies and wine
  - ✓ Allows Daniel and Friends to eat vegetables and water
    - For their entire three year training



17 As for these four young men, God gave them knowledge and skill in all literature and wisdom; and Daniel had understanding in all visions and dreams.

- God honors Daniel's Commitment to Not Defile Himself
  - Daniel and Friends receive
    - ✓ From the hand of God
    - ✓ Knowledge and skill in all literature and wisdom.
    - ✓ Daniel receives an extra blessing
      - Understanding of all visions and dreams
    - ✓ Notice the "all" qualifier of the wisdom and visions and dreams
      - Not limited to what was taught in the three years of training
      - That is why they were superior to all of the king's advisors



<sup>18</sup> Now at the end of the days, when the king had said that they should be brought in, the chief of the eunuchs brought them in before Nebuchadnezzar. <sup>19</sup> Then the king interviewed them, and among them all none was found like Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah; therefore they served before the king.

#### Final Exam

- Ashpenaz brings the students in for their final exam
  - ✓ Before the King
  - ✓ Defense of what they had learned in their training
- End of the days ... what was the time period?
  - √ Three years



<sup>20</sup> And in all matters of wisdom *and* understanding about which the king examined them, he found them ten times better than all the magicians *and* astrologers who *were* in all his realm.

- Daniel and Friends Ace the Exam
  - Nebuchadnezzar examines Daniel and Friends
    - ✓ Wide range of inquiry ... all matters of wisdom and understanding.
    - ✓ Found them 10 times better
      - An order of magnitude not exactly 10 times
      - Than All the magicians and astrologer who were in All his realm
        - » Not just those captives that finished the training
        - » All advisors in All the king's realm




- <sup>21</sup> Thus Daniel continued until the first year of King Cyrus.
- Training Will Endure
  - Daniel endures beyond the Babylonian Empire
    - ✓ Into the Persian Empire
  - Does not mean Daniel only continued until 1st Year of King Cyrus
    - ✓ Scripture tells us he continued into the reign of King Darius
  - King Cyrus
    - ✓ Came to power at the end of the 70 years of Jewish Exile
