





### Observations

- Verse 1
  - ✓ After the Sabbath
    - Correct translation in the Greek is
      - » After the Sabbaths
      - » More than one Sabbath
        - » High Sabbath
        - » Shabbat 7<sup>th</sup> day of the week
  - ✓ First day of the week
    - We refer to as Sunday
    - At dawn Mary Magdalene and the other Mary come to see the tomb
    - How do they know where it is?
      - » They were there when Joseph laid Jesus in the tomb ... Matthew 27:59-61

### Scripture Text

28 Now after the Sabbath, as the first *day* of the week began to dawn, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb. <sup>2</sup> And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat on it. <sup>3</sup> His countenance was like lightning, and his clothing as white as snow. <sup>4</sup> And the guards shook for fear of him, and became like dead *men*.

<sup>59</sup> When Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, <sup>60</sup> and laid it in his new tomb which he had hewn out of the rock; and he rolled a large stone against the door of the tomb, and departed. <sup>61</sup> And Mary Magdalene was there, and the other Mary, sitting opposite the tomb.

### Observations

- Verses 2-3
  - √ Great Earthquake
    - Caused by the angel of the LORD
      - » Descended from heaven
      - » Rolled back the stone from the door
        - » Angel not Jesus
        - » Jesus has already risen
      - » Sat on the stone
    - Angelic appearance
      - » Like lightning
      - » Clothing was white as snow

### Scripture Text

    - These are the Jewish guards
    - Fear from the angelic sight
    - Were paralyzed with fear

- Verses 5-7
  - ✓ Angel speaks to the women
    - Not to the guards
    - Announce the resurrection
      - » Was crucified Is risen
    - Come see the place
      - » Witness that Jesus is no longer here
      - » They already witnessed Jesus being laid in the tomb by Joseph
    - Go quickly and tell His disciples
      - » Jesus is risen from the dead
      - » Just as He said Jesus told them in advance ... He was preparing them
      - » Go to the pre-arranged meeting place and you will see Him

### Scripture Text

<sup>5</sup> But the angel answered and said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. And go quickly and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead, and indeed He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him. Behold, I have told you."

    - Quickly leave the tomb
      - » With fear and great joy
      - » Ran to bring the news to His disciples.

### Scripture Text

<sup>5</sup> But the angel answered and said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He is risen, as He said. Come, see the place where the Lord lay. And go quickly and tell His disciples that He is risen from the dead, and indeed He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him. Behold, I have told you."

<sup>8</sup> So they went out quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to bring His disciples word.

- Verses 9-10
  - ✓ On the way to tell the disciples
    - The resurrected Jesus meets them
  - ✓ Jesus' first words ... Post resurrection
    - Rejoice
    - Do not be afraid
    - Go and tell My brethren to go to Galilee
    - There they will see me
  - ✓ Jesus reiterated angel's instructions
  - ✓ Woman grab hold of His feet and worship Him

### Scripture Text

<sup>9</sup> And as they went to tell His disciples, behold, Jesus met them, saying, "Rejoice!" So they came and held Him by the feet and worshiped Him. <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell My brethren to go to Galilee, and there they will see Me."

### **Event: The Soldiers are Bribed**

The soldiers are bribed	28:11-15	-	-	-	

### Observations

- Verses 11-15
  - ✓ Jewish guards not Roman
    - Return to the city to inform the chief priests what has happened
  - ✓ Chief priests and elders consult together on what they should do
    - Notice they do not go to the Lord to direct their path - provided direction
    - Their solution
      - » Bribery bribe the guards to lie
      - » Say the disciples stole the body
      - » They will back them up before Pilate
    - The guards take the money
      - » Did as instructed

### Scripture Text

of the guard came into the city and reported to the chief priests all the things that had happened. 12 When they had assembled with the elders and consulted together, they gave a large sum of money to the soldiers, 13 saying, "Tell them, 'His disciples came at night and stole Him *away* while we slept.' 14 And if this comes to the governor's ears, we will appease him and make you secure." 15 So they took the money and did as they were instructed; and this saying is commonly reported among the Jews until this day.

### Observations

- Verse 16
  - ✓ Eleven disciples go to Galilee
    - As the Angel and Jesus instructed
    - 11 The 12 minus Judas
      - » Before Matthias is selected to replace Judas ... Acts 1:15-26
      - » Some scholars believe that Peter and the 11 jumped the gun with the selection of Matthias to replace Judas
      - » They believe that Paul is actually the replacement disciple and that he was selected personally by Jesus on the Damascus road ... Acts 9
  - ✓ To the appointed mountain
    - Pre-arrange meeting place

### Scripture Text

Galilee, to the mountain which Jesus had appointed for them. <sup>17</sup> When they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some doubted. <sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, *even* to the end of the age."     - They worship Him
    - Some doubted
  - ✓ Jesus commissions the 11 disciples
    - All authority in Heaven and earth
    - Make disciples of all the nations
    - Baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit trinity
    - Teaching them to observe all things
       I have commanded you
    - I am with you always even to the end of the age

### Scripture Text

Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, to the mountain which Jesus had appointed for them. <sup>17</sup> When they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some doubted. <sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. <sup>19</sup> Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, *even* to the end of the age." <ul> <li>Three women start for the sepulcher, followed by other women bearing spices.</li> <li>The three find the stone rolled away.</li> <li>Mary Magdalene goes to tell the disciples.</li> </ul>	•	•	23:55-24:9	20:1-2
<ul> <li>Mary, the mother of James and Joses, draws near the tomb and sees the angel of the Lord.</li> <li>She goes back to meet the other women following with the spices.</li> </ul>	28:2	-	-	-
<ul> <li>Meanwhile Peter and John, alerted by Mary Magdalene, arrive, look in, and go away.</li> </ul>	-	-	-	20:3-10
<ul> <li>Mary Magdalene returns weeping, sees the two angels and then Jesus.</li> <li>Goes as He bid her, to tell the disciples.</li> </ul>	-	-	-	20:11-18
<ul> <li>Mary (mother of James and Joses), meanwhile, has met the women with the spices and returning with them, they see the two angels.</li> </ul>		16:5	24:4

## Section 1 Corinthians The risen Christ, faith's reality 15:1-11

### Observations

- Verses 1-6
  - √ Gospel The good news
    - What is the good news?
      - » Paul is going to unpack this for us in the rest of this chapter
    - Paul's audience -Corinthians .. You
      - » Received the Gospel
      - » Stand in the Gospel
      - » Saved by the Gospel
        - » If you hold fast
        - » Else you believe in vain
    - Gospel in a nutshell
      - » Verses 3-4

### Scripture Text

**15** Moreover, brethren, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received and in which you stand, <sup>2</sup> by which also you are saved, if you hold fast that word which I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.

<sup>3</sup> For I delivered to you first of all that which I also received: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, <sup>4</sup> and that He was buried, and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures, <sup>5</sup> and that He was seen by Cephas, then by the twelve. <sup>6</sup> After that He was seen by over five hundred brethren at once, of whom the greater part remain to the present, but some have fallen asleep.

## Section: The Risen Christ, Faith's Reality



Section	1 Corinthians
The risen Christ, faith's reality	15:1-11

### Observations

- Verses 7-11
  - ✓ Born out of due time
    - After going through all the appearances, Paul lists himself
  - ✓ Least of the apostles
    - Not worthy to be called an apostle
    - Persecuted the church of God
    - By grace he is an apostle
      - » Not because or merit
    - Paul labored more abundantly
      - » Not bragging on himself
      - » Bragging on the grace of God
      - » End result fruits of salvation

### Scripture Text

<sup>7</sup> After that He was seen by James, then by all the apostles. <sup>8</sup> Then last of all He was seen by me also, as by one born out of due time. <sup>9</sup> For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. <sup>10</sup> But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not in vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all, yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me. <sup>11</sup> Therefore, whether it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

## Section: The Risen Christ, Our Hope



Section	1 Corinthians
The risen Christ, our hope	15:12-19

### Observations

- Verses 12-19
  - ✓ The Resurrection is the linchpin of the Christian faith
  - ✓ If there is no resurrection.
    - Christ is not risen
    - Our preaching is empty
    - Your faith is empty
    - We are false witnesses of God
    - Your faith is futile
    - You are still in your sins
    - Those already dead have perished
    - We are of all men the most pitiable

#### Scripture Text

12 Now if Christ is preached that He has been raised from the dead, how do some among you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? 13 But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ is not risen. <sup>14</sup> And if Christ is not risen, then our preaching is empty and your faith *is* also empty. <sup>15</sup> Yes, and we are found false witnesses of God, because we have testified of God that He raised up Christ, whom He did not raise up—if in fact the dead do not rise. 16 For if *the* dead do not rise, then Christ is not risen. <sup>17</sup> And if Christ is not risen, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins! 18 Then also those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. 19 If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men the most pitiable.

## Section: The Last Enemy Destroyed



Section Section	1 Corinthians
The last enemy destroyed	15:20-28

### Observations

- Verses 20-24
  - ✓ Christ is risen from the dead
    - Christ is the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep
  - ✓ By man death came
    - In Adam all die
  - ✓ By man resurrection of the dead came
    - In Christ all are made alive
  - ✓ Order
    - Christ first
    - Then believers at Christ's coming
    - Then comes the end

### Scripture Text

<sup>20</sup> But now Christ is risen from the dead, *and* has become the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. <sup>21</sup> For since by man *came* death, by Man also *came* the resurrection of the dead. <sup>22</sup> For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive. <sup>23</sup> But each one in his own order: Christ the firstfruits, afterward those *who are* Christ's at His coming. <sup>24</sup> Then *comes* the end, when He delivers the kingdom to God the Father, when He puts an end to all rule and all authority and power.

## Section: The Last Enemy Destroyed



Section	1 Corinthians
The last enemy destroyed	15:20-28

### Observations

- Verses 25-28
  - ✓ Christ will reign over all
    - All enemies are put under His feet
    - The last enemy is death
      - » It will be destroyed

### Scripture Text

enemies under His feet. <sup>26</sup> The last enemy that will be destroyed is death. <sup>27</sup> For "He has put all things under His feet." But when He says "all things are put under Him," it is evident that He who put all things under Him is excepted. <sup>28</sup> Now when all things are made subject to Him, then the Son Himself will also be subject to Him who put all things under Him, that God may be all in all.

## Section: Effects of Denying the Resurrection



Section	1 Corinthians
Effects of denying the resurrection	15:29-34

### Observations

- Verses 29-34
  - ✓ Paul's motivates to live righteously
    - If the dead do not rise
      - » Let us eat and drink.
      - » for tomorrow we die
    - Evil company corrupts good habits
    - Awake to righteousness
      - » Do not sin
    - Seek the knowledge of God
      - » Some Corinthians lack knowledge
      - » To their shame

### Scripture Text

<sup>29</sup> Otherwise, what will they do who are baptized for the dead, if the dead do not rise at all?
