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## THERE WERE MORE THAN THREE KINGS

t Christmas time, homes across the land are decorated with various memorial backdrops - scenes that commemorate the birth of Christ. The Bethlehem star, various statues, animals, buildings and even palm and cedar trees bring to mind the virgin birth of Christ. This, the humble beginning of history's most important man annually reminds the world that the most significant event in history was not measured by wealth but by God's

various animals and perhaps a few shepherds are present to witness the event. But also present in most of these images are three striking characters who followed the Star that brought them from the East. Manger scenes often show them, either mounted on camels, or standing before the Child with their camels nearby.

Among Christians in America, it is common to recall their long trip from the East in lyrics of a beautiful love, Mary, Joseph, the Christ Child, hymn for the season, written in 1857 On their camels, they have traveled

"We three kings of Orient are "Bearing gifts we traverse afar "Field and fountain,

"Moor and mountain

"Following vander star . . . "

Sometimes, they are referred to as the "three wise men." Dressed in kingly robes, dyed in royal tints and trimmed with gold and jewels, they wear turbans and carry three small treasure boxes filled, respectively, with gold, frankincense and myrrh. the trade routes through the fertile crescent, from the land of the Chaldeans, to their final arrival in Jerusalem. There, they hold private council with King Herod, inquiring about the birth of a special child who was, they said, the King of the Jews. They have been guided by an astronomical phenomenon - a star that is mysteriously able to direct them southward to a specific location in Bethlehem.

There, they find the baby Jesus in a humble stable, lying in a cattle

cows, sheep and chickens. They present their gifts to Him, then ride into obscurity, taking a circuitous route to avoid Herod's troops, as instructed by God.

This is the story, told over and over again, that is deeply ingrained into the lore of the faithful. To believers and unbelievers alike, it has become part of our culture. There is no more expressive picture of love. family and hope than this scene of a humble birth that will save the

#### BETHLEHEM - SCENE ONE


This, the manger scene, has long been venerated in churches around the world. Unfortunately, there are several things wrong with it.

- Three Kings The Christmas Story
  - Sometimes referred to as the "Three Wise Men"
  - Usually dressed in kingly robes, dyed in royal tints and trimmed with gold and jewels
  - They are usually depicted wearing turbans and carrying three small treasure boxes filled with gold, frankincense and myrrh
  - They travel on camels via the trade routes through the fertile crescent, from the land of the Chaldeans, to their final arrival in Jerusalem.
  - They come to King Herod inquiring about the birth of a special child who was born king of the Jews.
  - They have been guided by a special star.
  - They arrive in Bethlehem and find the baby Jesus in a humble stable.
  - They present Him their gifts and return back home.

  - However, truth be told, there are a few inaccuracies associated with the story, as told and memorialized with our figurine sets, Christmas cards and songs.



- Three Kings The Nativity Manger Scene
  - The Nativity Manger scene has long been venerated in churches around the world.
  - There are a few corrective observations to be made.
    - The wise men would NOT have worn royal robes of purple, scarlet, blue and gold thread. NOR would they have worn turbans.
    - 2. They would NOT have ridden on camels.
    - 3. There were certainly MORE THAN THREE of them.
    - 4. Their gifts would have been delivered as part of a FAR LARGER TRIBUTE.

- Three Kings The Persian Connection
  - The wise men lived in the east, in Mesopotamia.
  - They were part of a hereditary priesthood.
  - The term "Wise Men" (Matthew 2:1) is translated from the Greek *Magoi* derived from the Persian proper noun, which was the name of their caste.
  - In English we call them Magi, which has NOTHING to do with magic or the office of magician.
  - They were astronomers. They watched planetary motions, movements of the Sun and Moon through regions in the heavens.
  - The Magi were invested with great political power throughout a declining succession of powers -Babylon, Medo-Persian, Greek and Parthian.
  - The Magi would neither acknowledge nor allow the worship of personal gods. They absolutely forbad the veneration of any sort of image.



13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying: 14 "Glory to God in the highest, And on earth peace, goodwill toward men!" 15 So it was, when the angels had gone away from them into heaven, that the shepherds said to one another, "Let us now go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has come to pass, which the Lord has made known to us." 16 And they came with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the Babe lying in a manger. 17 Now when they had seen Him, they made widely known the saying which was told them concerning Child. 18 And all those who heard it marveled at those things which them bv told shepherds. 19 But Mary kept all these things and pondered them in her heart. <sup>20</sup> Then the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told them. --- Luke 2:13-20 ... - Three Kings The Persian Connection
  - From the earliest beginnings in the 7<sup>TH</sup> century BC, they were known to have centered their worship about an altar, upon which burned some sort of "eternal flame". They envisioned God as a fiery reality, and the heavenly host of stars and planets as extensions.
  - The Magi were said to possess an ethereal quality, exuding an atmosphere of great spiritual knowledge and power.
  - Their mystical spirituality carried overtones of the occult ... of hidden knowledge.
  - They carried bundles of thin rods (barsoms), which were used for divining, forecasting and prophesying.
    - They were dropped onto a mat (think pick-up-sticks).
    - By reading the patterns they displayed they were apparently able to reveal hidden knowledge.

- Three Kings The Persian Connection
  - By the mid 6<sup>TH</sup> century BC, in the reign of Cyrus the Great, they began to be associated with Zoroastrian faith, honoring a single, self-created "god of light" whom they addressed as Ahura Mazda.
  - They were monotheistic, hereditary priests, regarded as mediators between god and man.
  - Upon flaming altars, they made blood sacrifices to their god.
  - Thanks to a historical encounter with the Jews in captivity, the Magi became extremely close to ancient Jewish worship and prophecy.









# DUALISM IN ZOROASTRIANISM

- Existence of good and evil
- Cosmically: opposing forces within universe
- Ongoing battle between Ahura Mazda and Angra Mainyu (evil)
- Morally: opposing forces within mind

#### • Three Kings - The Persian Connection

- At the close of the Babylon exile, the prophet Daniel lived among them as a respected spiritual authority.
- Daniel's last recorded vision took place in the 3<sup>RD</sup> year of the reign of Cyrus (536 BC) and dealt with the angelic battle between Michael and the dark posers of the heavens.
- Some time later, Daniel died. He was probably close to his mid-to-late eighties. With great ceremony, he was buried in the territory of ancient Persia.
- Soon the captivity ended and the Jews returned to Israel. But Daniel's work and spiritual influence intersected the lives of the Magi with powerful historical effects.
- Through him, they knew of the coming Messiah.

- Three Kings The Persian Connection
  - By the beginning of the 4<sup>TH</sup> century BC, the system of worship observed by the Magi was heavily influenced by Judaism. Their monotheism had most probably begun to incorporate the teaching of Israel's prophets, laying the groundwork for their later appearance in Israel to herald the coming of the King.
  - At the beginning of the 3<sup>RD</sup> Century BC, Magian Zoroastrianism was the state religion of Persia.
  - Down through the days of Seleucid rule, to the time of Christ, they retained their power.








• Three Kings - The Persian Connection

- The upper council of the Magi were called *Megistanes*.
- They carried enormous political and religious power.
- They were the kingmakers of the ancient world.
- When they met to declare God's will to the authorities of the state, their decision was considered to be binding.
- They combined wealth, power and a mystical connection to the God of the universe that no one else could touch.
- With all this is mind, consider the effect they must have had when they entered Jerusalem.

- Three Kings What Would They Have Worn?
  - The traditional costume of the Magi emanated an air of spiritual authority. They wore conical hat of pure white, with side flaps that covered the sides of their heads, which were apparently tied beneath their chins. Their robes were also pure white.








#### Three Kings - What Would They Have Ridden?

 When the Magi traveled they were regally mounted on the most excellent horses, outfitted with the finest accessories. The Magi bred the steeds that became the forerunners of today's magnificent Arabians. They are said to have despised camels.

The Magi travelled with an armed cavalry, attendants, cooks, soldiers, wagons and servants.





- Three Kings What About The Gifts They Brought?
  - 4. The Magi did NOT appear in Bethlehem at the manger, but in Bethlehem home where Jesus was living as a young child (probably around 1-2 years old).

The Bible is silent on why Mary and Joseph were in Bethlehem after Jesus' birth.

Since the Magi were honoring a king, their gifts would have been delivered as part of a far larger tribute than simple three little boxes. Their wealth was

legendary.





#### Three Kings - What About The Gifts They Brought?

4. The gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh were also prophetic, speaking of our Lord's offices of king, priest, and savior.

Gold speaks of His kingship; frankincense was a spice used in the priestly duties; and myrrh was an embalming ointment anticipating His death.

In the Millennium, He will also receive the gifts of gold and frankincense;" but NO myrrh: His death was once and for all.

The multitude of camels shall cover your land,
The dromedaries of Midian and Ephah;
All those from Sheba shall come;
They shall bring gold and incense,
And they shall proclaim the praises of the LORD.
