


Gaul rejoices in his service to the Lord, despite not knowing his fate, whether release or death at the hands of his captors, and asks his readers to do the same. He prepares to send two men back to the Philippians, with this letter. The first is Timothy, who according to Paul, has a tender heart for the Philippians and who has been a faithful servant to both Paul and the gospel. The second is Epaphroditus, who brought the original message to Paul from Philippi. Epaphroditus suffered much, almost to the point of death, for the gospel and still had a great concern for his fellow Christians in Philippi.
