


#### Lesson Preview - Introduction



Preview ... Future Hope: Part II

Paul teaches the need to have a proper attitude toward church leaders and other believers. Struggling believers are to be the recipient of special care from the church members. Believers are to rejoice, give thanks, follow the Holy Spirit, and abstain from evil activities. Paul concludes with a prayer that the God of peace will allow them to stand before Him one day fully set apart to Him. This hope can be guaranteed because of the faithful character of God.









- Exhortations We Urge You, Brethren
  - RECOGNIZE
    - Paul urges the Thessalonian believers to recognize their spiritual leaders.
    - Spiritual leaders are described in THREE WAYS:
      - THOSE WHO LABOR AMONG YOU
      - 2. And are over you in the Lord
      - 3. AND ADMONISH YOU
    - Paul's urging is a bit unusual since the Thessalonian church had only been in existence for several months
      - Basically every member was a new convert
      - God had called out from among them a few who would be their teachers, leaders and overseers.
      - They had not had any training in a seminary, college, or Bible Institute.
      - All they had was what Paul had given them in his few short weeks in the city and what the Holy Spirit had taught them in the days and weeks since.

Exhortations - We Urge You, Brethren

#### THOSE WHO LABOR AMONG YOU

- Paul urged them to recognize their spiritual leaders according to their ministry - their service
  - Not for what they were
  - But what they were doing as ministers of the Lord.

#### 2. AND ARE OVER YOU IN THE LORD

- Believers are all on the same level (pastor, teachers, elders, people) - we are all children of God
- We are all members of His body (1 Corinthians 12)
- Each of us possesses different God-given gifts
- We are to use our gifts to serve each other
- <sup>11</sup> And He Himself gave some *to be* apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers, <sup>12</sup> for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ, --- Ephesians 4:11-12 ... NKJV
  - It is this unique giftedness that needs to be recognized

JESUS CALLS US TO BE SERVANT-LEADERS ... Matthew 20:24-28

#### 3. AND ADMONISH YOU

 The Thessalonians were urged to accept the admonition given to them by their teachers.

• Exhortations - We Urge You, Brethren

- ESTEEM THEM VERY HIGHLY IN LOVE
  - Believers are to esteem their leaders, and to esteem them very highly in love.
  - Believers should do this FOR THEIR WORK'S SAKE.
    - Their leaders don't deserve esteem because of their title, or because of their personality, but because of their labor on behalf of God's people.

"Christian ministers, who preach the whole truth, and labor in the word and doctrine, are entitled to more than respect; the apostle commands them to be esteemed, abundantly, and superabundantly; and this is to be done in love." --- Clarke

 Paul twice mentions the work of ministry and connects it to the respect these servants of God should have from those they serve.

• Exhortations - We Urge You, Brethren

- BE AT PEACE AMONG YOURSELVES
  - With this simple command Paul said believers should simply put away all their disputes and arguments.
  - This is a great way to esteem and love the leaders of your fellowship.
  - No fellowship can grow spiritually without its members being at peace among themselves.

- Exhortations We Exhort You, Brethren
  - WE EXHORT YOU
    - Having just urged the Thessalonians believers to recognize and esteem their leaders, Paul now exhorts them in how to deal with difficult believers.
    - To EXHORT is to tell someone what they must do, but without harshness or a critical spirit.
      - It is not scolding or condemnation, but neither is it merely a suggestion or advice.
      - It is urgent and serious, but associated with comfort.
    - Paul exhorts the Thessalonian believers to minister in diverse ways, depending on the state of the person who needs the ministry.
      - If someone is UNRULY,
         Then the duty of the believer is to WARN them.
      - 2. Others need COMFORT from the believer.
      - Others need to be UPHELD by the believer.

## • Exhortations - We Exhort You, Brethren

#### WARN THOSE WHO ARE UNRULY

- The UNRULY are those who are out of order, using a military word that describes the soldier that breaks ranks or marches out of step.
- This is the self-willed person who simply demands to hold their own opinion or preference.
- These must be WARNED.

#### COMFORT THE FAINTHEARTED

- The FAINTHEARTED are those who, are "small-souled".
- By nature or experience they tend to be timid, reticent and lack courage.
- These need COMFORT in the sense of assisting strength to be brought to them.

## • Exhortations - We Exhort You, Brethren

#### UPHOLD THE WEAK

 The WEAK must be UPHELD, and assisted with an eye to building their own strength instead of perpetuating their weakness. Romans 14-15

#### BE PATIENT WITH ALL

- Though different approaches must be taken with different people, believers must be PATIENT WITH ALL.
- This is because true believers are validated by their ability to love and help difficult people.
- We do not look for only perfect people to minister to and to minister with.



<sup>12</sup> And we urge you, brethren, to recognize those who labor among you, and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, <sup>13</sup> and to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. - Exhortations Always Pursue What is Good
  - SEE THAT NO ONE RENDERS EVIL FOR EVIL TO ANYONE
    - The believer should never seek revenge or vengeance, but let God take up our side.
      - 19 Beloved, do not avenge yourselves, but *rather* give place to wrath; for it is written, "Vengeance *is* Mine, I will repay," says the Lord. --- Romans 12:19 ... NKJV
    - Instead, we must ALWAYS PURSUE WHAT IS GOOD BOTH FOR YOURSELVES AND FOR ALL.
    - When we have a forgiving heart towards others, not only is it good for them, it is good for ourselves.

A BELIEVER'S LIFE CONSISTS OF DOING GOOD AND SUFFERING EVIL.



12 And we urge you, brethren, to recognize those who labor among you, and are over you in the Lord and admonish you, <sup>13</sup> and to esteem them very highly in love for their work's sake. - Exhortations Always Pursue What is Good
  - SEE THAT NO ONE RENDERS EVIL FOR EVIL TO ANYONE
    - What about "an eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth"?

<sup>23</sup> But if *any* harm follows, then you shall give life for life, <sup>24</sup> eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot, <sup>25</sup> burn for burn, wound for wound, stripe for stripe. --- Exodus 21:23-25 ... NKJV

The principle is sometimes referred using the Latin term *lex talionis*.

- The Jews abused this letter of the Law and they used the Law to take revenge upon each other.
- Christ established a higher standard ... Matthew 5:38-39

<sup>38</sup> "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' <sup>39</sup> But I tell you not to resist an evil person. But whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also.

- --- Matthew 5:38-39 ... NKJV [SERMON ON THE MOUNT]
  - This principle is echoed by Peter ... 1 Peter 3:8-9

<sup>8</sup> Finally, all *of you be* of one mind, having compassion for one another; love as brothers, *be* tenderhearted, *be* courteous; <sup>9</sup> not returning evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary blessing, knowing that you were called to this, that you may inherit a blessing.





## Encouragements - The Will of God

- Paul now turns his attention to instructions regarding our relationship with God.
  - These instructions are mostly short and to the point.
  - They come across as a bit choppy.
  - However all are crucial to a healthy relationship with God.

#### REJOICE ALWAYS

- Not only rejoicing in happy things, but in sorrows also.
- The believer can REJOICE ALWAYS because their joy isn't based in circumstances, but in God.
- Circumstances change, but God does not.

#### **JOY VERSUS HAPPINESS**

**Joy** is rooted in our relationship with God. Jesus has reconciled us to God - rejoice!

**HAPPINESS** is rooted in circumstances. Happiness is ephemeral.

- Encouragements The Will of God
  - PRAY WITHOUT CEASING
    - Believers are to pray continually.
    - We cannot bow our heads, close our eyes, and fold our hands without ceasing, but those are customs of prayer, NOT prayer itself.
    - Prayer is communication with God, and we can live each moment of the day in a constant, flowing, conversation with God.
    - Treasured truths regarding PRAYER...
      - The use of the voice IS NOT an essential element.
      - The posture of prayer IS NOT of primary importance.
      - The place of prayer IS NOT of great importance.
      - The particular time of prayer IS NOT important.

A BELIEVER SHOULD NEVER BE IN A PLACE WHERE THEY CAN NOT PRAY.

- Encouragements The Will of God
  - In everything give thanks
    - We don't give thanks FOR EVERYTHING, but IN EVERYTHING.
    - We recognize God's sovereign hand is in charge, and NOT blind fate or chance.

"When **JOY** and **PRAYER** are married their first born child is **GRATITUDE**." ---Charles Spurgeon

- FOR THIS IS THE WILL OF GOD IN CHRIST JESUS CONCERNING YOU
  - After each one of these exhortations REJOICE ALWAYS, PRAY WITHOUT CEASING, in EVERYTHING GIVE THANKS we are told to do them because it IS THE WILL OF GOD.
  - The idea ISN'T "this is God's will, so you MUST DO IT."
  - The idea IS rather "this is God's will, so you CAN DO IT."
  - It isn't easy to REJOICE ALWAYS, PRAY WITHOUT CEASING, and IN EVERYTHING GIVE THANKS, but we CAN DO IT because it is God's will.

## Encouragements - Do's and Don'ts

- Do not quench the Spirit
  - We can quench the fire of the Holy Spirit by our doubt, our indifference, our rejection of Him, or by the distraction of other things.
  - When a believer draws attention to themselves, it is a sure sign of quenching the Holy Spirit.
  - This command is based on the familiar image of the Holy Spirit as a fire or a flame.
    - In this context the fire cannot be created,
    - However we can provide the environment in which it can burn brightly.
    - Conversely a flame can be extinguished when it is ignored and no longer tended, or when the flame is overwhelmed by something else.

THE HOLY SPIRIT LOVES US. HOW ELSE COULD WE GRIEVE HIM? YOU CAN ONLY GRIEVE IF YOU LOVE!

## Encouragements - Do's and Don'ts

- Do not despise prophecies
  - We recognize that the Lord speaks to and through His people today, and we learn to be open to His voice.
  - Bear in mind, we always test prophecies (next verse), but we DO NOT DESPISE PROPHECIES.
  - It is possible that prophesy was being despised because individuals were abusing the gift. [speculation]

<sup>3</sup> But he who prophesies speaks edification and exhortation and comfort to men. --- 1 Corinthians 14:3 ... NKJV

- Encouragements Do's and Don'ts
  - TEST ALL THINGS; HOLD FAST WHAT IS GOOD
    - Evil and deception can show itself even in a spiritual setting, so it is important for believers to TEST ALL THINGS.
    - When the test has been made, according to the standard of God's Word and the discernment of spirit among the leaders, we then HOLD FAST TO WHAT IS GOOD.
    - Between the time Paul last saw the Thessalonians and the writing of this letter, he had been in Berea (Acts 17:10-12).
      - There, the believers were of a noble character because they heard Paul's preaching and diligently searched the Scriptures to see if what he said was true.
      - Paul wanted the Thessalonians to have more of the heart and mind of the Bereans.

- Encouragements Do's and Don'ts
  - ABSTAIN FROM EVERY FORM OF EVIL
    - Believers are to have nothing to do with evil in all its forms. Notice there is more than one form of evil.





- Blessing and Admonition Body, Soul, and Spirit
  - Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely
    - The God of Peace Himself is the Lord Jesus Christ
    - Jesus will SANCTIFY the believer COMPLETELY

## Blessing and Admonition - He Will Do It

- He who calls you is faithful
  - Jesus is the one who calls believers
  - Jesus is FAITHFUL
    - We are faithless, helpless, hopeless and headed for hell
    - He is faithful, powerful, full of hope and by His blood we are headed for heaven
  - Jesus WILL DO IT
    - Aren't you glad it does not depend on you!

<sup>6</sup> being confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete *it* until the day of Jesus Christ;

13 for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for *His* good pleasure.

- Blessing and Admonition Pray, Greet, & Read
  - Brethren, pray for us
    - Paul was an apostle, and the Thessalonian church was made up of young Christians.
    - Paul still believed he needed their prayers, so he simply asked, "PRAY FOR US."
  - GREET ALL THE BRETHREN WITH A HOLY KISS
    - The idea is that Paul wants those who read the letter to greet all the believers in Thessalonica on his behalf.
    - If he were there in person, he would greet all the brethren with a holy kiss himself, but since he was not there, he would send the greeting through this letter.
    - This is commanded 4 other times in the NT Romans 16:16; 1 Corinthians 16:20; 2 Corinthians 13:12; 1 Peter 5:14

A hug and a kiss on the cheek, men with men, women with women, were cultural expressions of greeting. In our culture this is akin to a handshake.

- Blessing and Admonition Pray, Greet, & Read
  - I CHARGE YOU BY THE LORD
    - Paul used a strong phrase here. It was important that this epistle be read among believers.
    - This is an unusual statement, unique in Paul's letters.
    - Scholars are not quite sure why Paul added this phrase at the end of his letter.
    - Many different reasons have been suggested.
      - Since the letter was a substitute for his personal presence, Paul did not want any disappointment at his absence to dampen the spread of the letter.
      - Paul wanted to make sure that the church heard the letter first-hand, and not through intermediaries who might misstate his message.


- Blessing and Admonition Grace Be With You
  - THE GRACE OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST BE WITH YOU
    - Notice the letter began with a greeting of grace. 1:1

1 Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ

- Now it concludes with grace as well.
- This is the closing signature of Paul
- Used on all of his letters.
- Some scholars cite this signature as evidence of a Pauline authorship of Hebrews
   Hebrews 13:25
   25 Grace be with you all. Amen.

**GRACE** is God's unmerited favor, His bestowal of love and acceptance on us because of who He is and what Jesus has done. **GRACE** means that He loves us, and all the reasons are in Him. **GRACE** means we can stop working for His love and start receiving it.


