¹⁷ Then Daniel answered, and said before the king, "Let your gifts be for yourself, and give your rewards to another; yet I will read the writing to the king, and make known to him the interpretation.

Daniel Answers the King

- Let your gifts be for yourself
 - ✓ Daniel is not motivated by profit although he is a Prophet ☺
 - Daniel's interpretation will not be influenced by the rewards
 - ✓ Later Daniel will accept these gifts
 - Only after the interpretation of the writing
 - Only after the rewards would be shown to be of little value
 - » The Robe
 - » The Gold Chain
 - » The Position ... 3rd in the Kingdom
 - » Kingdom that will be doomed by the end of the night
 - ✓ Daniel is not holding back his contempt for the king
 - Later he will draw a contrast to the king's grandfather Nebuchadnezzar

Daniel 5:17 - Observations

Daniel Answers the King

- Give your rewards to another
 - ✓ Reminiscent of Elisha's refusal of Naaman's gifts
 - 2 Kings 5:15-16 -
 - Punishment of Gehazi for accepting them
 - » 2 Kings 5:20-27
- Yet I will read the writing
 - ✓ Daniel is in his 80's at this point
 - ✓ Daniel is retired
- I will make known the interpretation
 - ✓ Daniel is confident in God
 - ✓ Not only read the writing
 - ✓ But interprets it as well

and all his aides, and came and stood before him; and he said, "Indeed, now I know that *there is* no God in all the earth, except in Israel; now therefore, please take a gift from your servant."

- Daniel Rebukes Belshazzar
 - You have not humbled your heart
 - ✓ Daniel states that Belshazzar knew of the account of Nebuchadnezzar
 - ✓ By knowing the account Belshazzar should have humbled himself
 - Like his Grandfather Nebuchadnezzar
 - Would not have to pay the "dumb" tax
 - ✓ But Belshazzar did not.
 - Deliberate contempt for God
 - Earlier Belshazzar had to be reminded who Daniel was
 - ✓ By the Queen
 - He may not have know who Daniel was
 - ✓ But he did know who his grandfather was
 - ✓ According to Daniel here, he knew of the incident of chapter 4
 - ✓ He would be held accountable

GOD WILL HOLD US ACCOUNTABLE FOR WHAT WE KNOW!

- Belshazzar Condemned for Challenging the Lord of Heaven
 - Belshazzar commanded the Holy Vessels of God be profaned
 - ✓ Pride had led to the king's command
 - ✓ Defiance against the God of Israel and the prophecy of Isaiah
 - ✓ APPLICATION: We are the Holy Vessels of God
 - Judgment is coming
 - ✓ The God who holds your breath in His hand and owns all your ways.
 - God holds your very breath
 - God holds the power of life and death in His hands
 - ✓ You have not glorified
 - You have defied and not glorified
 - Judgment is looming ... Hebrews 10:31



"There is nothing that keeps wicked men at any one moment out of hell, but the mere pleasure of God."


Most of the sermon's text consists of ten "considerations":

- 1. God may cast wicked men into hell at any given moment.
- The Wicked deserve to be cast into hell. Divine justice does not prevent God from destroying the Wicked at any moment.
- 3. The Wicked, at this moment, suffer under God's condemnation to Hell.
- 4. The Wicked, on earth at this very moment suffer the torments of Hell. The Wicked must not think, simply because they are not physically in Hell, that God (in Whose hand the Wicked now reside) is not at this very moment as angry with them as He is with those miserable creatures He is now tormenting in hell, and who at this very moment do feel and bear the fierceness of His wrath.
- At any moment God shall permit him, Satan stands ready to fall upon the Wicked and seize them as his own.
- If it were not for God's restraints, there are, in the souls of wicked men, hellish principles reigning which, presently, would kindle and flame out into hellfire.
- Simply because there are not visible means of death before them at any given moment, the Wicked should not feel secure.
- Simply because it is natural to care for oneself or to think that others may care for them, men should not think themselves safe from God's wrath.
- All that wicked men may do to save themselves from Hell's pains shall afford them nothing if they continue to reject Christ.
- God has never promised to save us from Hell, except for those contained in Christ through the covenant of Grace.

- Fingers of the Hand were Sent From Him
 - God is the source of the writing
 - ✓ God uses the fingers of a hand to write the writings
 - Reminiscent of the writing of the Ten Commandments
 - ✓ Exodus 31:18

 ✓ Deuteronomy 9:10

 18 And when He had made an end of speaking with him on Mount Sinai, He gave Moses two tablets of the Testimony, tablets of stone, written with the finger of God.

 Exodus 31:18 ... NKJV

- The Inscription ... MENE, MENE, TEKEL, UPHARSIN
 - The Talmud suggests that the writing was vertical and backwards.
 - Hebrew tradition the writing was Atbash encrypted
 - ✓ Atbash: A form of Hebrew encryption where the alphabet sequence is folded back on itself. [Note the Hebrew language has 22 glyphs or letters.]

Atbash Encryption

Atbash is a simple substitution cipher for the Hebrew alphabet. It consists in substituting aleph (the first letter) for tav (the last), beth (the second) for shin (one before last), and so on, reversing the alphabet. Hence the name, Aleph-Tav-Beth-Shin (אתבש). In the Book of Jeremiah, לב קמי Lev Kamai (51:1) is Atbash for כשדים Kasdim (Chaldeans), and שש Sheshakh (25:26; 51:41) is Atbash for בבל Bavel (Babylon).

The Atbash cipher for the modern Hebrew alphabet would be:

Plain: אבגדהוזחטיכלמנסעפצקרשת Cipher: תשרקצפעסנמלכיטחזוהדגבא

An Atbash cipher for the Latin alphabet would be as follows:

Plain: abcdefghijklmnopqrstuvwxyz Cipher: ZYXWVUTSRQPONMLKJIHGFEDCBA

An easier, simpler and faster way of doing this is:

First 13 letters: A|B|C|D|E|F|G|H|I|J|K|L|M Last 13 Letters: Z|Y|X|W|V|U|T|S|R|Q|P|O|N

Atbash can also be used to mean the same thing in any other alphabet as well. This is a very simple substitution cipher.

For example, in Atbash, the letters "nlmvb" indicate the word "money"

A few English words 'Atbash' into other English words. For example, "hob"="sly", "hold"="slow", "holy"="slob", "horn"="slim", "zoo"="all", "irk"="rip", "low"="old", "glow"="told", and "grog"="tilt." Some other English words Atbash into their own reverses, e.g., "wizard" = "draziw."



- Daniel has read the writing

 - √ Belshazzar gave command...
 - ✓ Daniel now receives his reward
 - Clothed in purple
 - Chain of Gold around his neck
 - Proclaimed as the third ruler in the kingdom
 - » A kingdom that would not last through the night

Belshazzar Slain

- That very night
 - ✓ God's judgment is swift
 - ✓ God's judgment is severe
 - √ God's judgment is to be feared
 - Hebrews 10:31-

- Historians Herodotus and Xenophon confirm Daniel's account
 - ✓ Cyrus diverted the Euphrates into a new channel
 - ✓ Guided by two deserters, Gobryas and Gadatas
 - ✓ Marched by the dry bed into the city
 - ✓ While the Babylonians were carousing at an annual feast to the gods.

Conquest of Babylon

The Cyrus Cylinder (Persian: منشور کوروش) is an ancient clay cylinder, now broken into several fragments, on which is written a declaration in Akkadian cuneiform script^[3] in the name of the Achaemenid king Cyrus the Great.^[4] It dates from the 6th century BC and was discovered in the ruins of Babylon in Mesopotamia (modern Iraq) in 1879.^[3] It is currently in the possession of the British Museum, which sponsored the expedition that discovered the cylinder. It was created and used as a foundation deposit following the Persian conquest of Babylon in 539 BC, when the Neo-Babylonian Empire was invaded by Cyrus and incorporated into his Persian Empire.

The Cylinder's text has traditionally been seen by Biblical scholars as corroborative evidence of Cyrus' policy of the repatriation of the Jewish people following their Babylonian captivity^[5] (an act that the Book of Ezra attributes to Cyrus^[6]), as the text refers to the restoration of cult sanctuaries and repatriation of deported peoples.^[7]





The text is written in an extremely formulaic style that can be divided into six distinct parts:

- <u>Lines 1–19</u>: an introduction reviling Nabonidus, the previous king of Babylon, and associating Cyrus with the god Marduk;
- <u>Lines 20–22</u>: detailing Cyrus's royal titles and genealogy, and his peaceful entry to Babylon;
- <u>Lines 22–34</u>: a commendation of Cyrus's policy of restoring Babylon;
- <u>Lines 34–35</u>: a prayer to Marduk on behalf of Cyrus and his son Cambyses;
- Lines 36–37: a declaration that Cyrus has enabled the people to live in peace and has increased the offerings made to the gods;
- Lines 38–45; details of the building activities ordered by Cyrus in Babylon. [31]


