

## **Study Questions**

11. When will this occur and before whom (3:13)?

- 1. Consider Paul's declaration of appointed affliction for believers (1 Thessalonians 3:3-4).
  - ❖ What does it mean to not be shaken by affliction/persecution (VERSE 3)?
  - ❖ What did Jesus have to say about "tribulation or persecution" in the parable of the sower (MATTHEW 13:18-23)? Which soil did not respond well to persecution?
  - ❖ How Jesus' persecution warning in MATTHEW 10:21-23 align with the false teachings of the "prosperity gospel" movement?
- 2. Reflect on Paul's relief when he heard the good news regarding the Thessalonians in VERSES 6-10.
  - When you pray for others what priority do you place on their faith?
  - Is the priority for their faith higher, lower or about the same compared with their physical needs?
  - Does the priority mix vary from person to person?
  - ❖ Who sets the agenda when you pray? Contemplate ROMANS 8:26-30.
- 3. Ponder VERSES 11-13 and Paul's prayer for the Thessalonian believers and by extension us.
  - How can you increase and abound in your love for others?
  - ❖ Loving others is not an option it is a command from our Lord. Read JOHN 15:9-17 and allow the Holy Spirit to show you tangible ways to obey Christ's Agape command.
  - ❖ In addition, Paul prays that the Holy Spirit will establish their hearts blameless in holiness before God the Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus (note all members of the trinity are involved). Is this your prayer for others? For yourself?
