Preview ... Introduction to the Thessalonian Epistles

In the 1st century Thessalonica was the capital of Macedonia and a thriving commercial center with a population of about 200,000. The church of Thessalonica was founded by Paul and Silas on Paul's 2nd missionary journey in the spring of AD 50. While Paul communicated much truth to the group of young believers at Thessalonica regarding eschatology, these epistles also cover many additional doctrinal and practical problems.

1 Thessalonians was written, by Paul, to encourage the believers in their suffering, and to draw their attention to the comfort that can be found in the 2nd coming of Christ.

With 2 Thessalonians Paul continues to remind them that Christ's return will vindicate their place as rightful children of the living God. He corrects the false teachings of some who said that the seven year Tribulation had already begun and that the Lord's return was so imminent that people should quit their jobs.











Paul - Author Profile

- Jewish-born in Tarsus, near the Lebanese border in modern Turkey.
- Roman citizen.
- Prominent Jewish religious leader, highly educated as a Pharisee.
- Persecuted Christians before his own dramatic conversion in AD 35 (Acts 9).
- Visited Thessalonica on his 2nd missionary journey about AD 50 (Acts 17). There he witnessed instant conversions followed by strong persecution.
- Known for his tireless pioneer work to the Gentiles.
- Imprisoned by Nero's regime in AD 67 in Rome
 (2 Timothy 4), where he was executed the next year.







Thessalonica - City Profile

- Thessalonica was founded in 325 BC by Cassander, who was one of Alexander the Great's generals.
 - Cassander named the city after his wife Thessaloniki, who was Alexander's step-sister.
- Thessalonica is situated on the Thermaic Gulf and is an important port in Macedonia.
- The modern city of Salonica or Thessaloniki is Greece's second-largest city.
- Located in present day Balkans
- In the 1st century Thessalonica was the capital of Macedonia and a thriving commercial center with a population of about 200,000.
- The city was also strategically situated on the Via Egnatia or Egnatian Way - a major-stone highway that was an extension of the Appian Way in Italy and connected Rome to the East.







Thessalonica - City Profile

- Antony and Octavius (the future Augustus)
 were here after their victory at Philippi.
 - In gratitude for their cooperation in the struggle against Cassius and Brutus, Thessalonica was made a free city like Athens.
 - No Roman soldiers were stationed in it; government was in the hands of a people's assembly, from whom the magistrates were chosen.
 - Kingdom preaching would make them fearful of losing their privileges of free status.

Marcus Antonius (January 14, 83 BC – August 1, 30 BC), commonly known in English as Mark or Marc Antony, was a Roman politician and general who played a critical role in the transformation of the Roman Republic from an oligarchy into the autocratic Roman Empire.








Occasion - 1 Thessalonians

- The church of Thessalonica was founded by Paul and Silas (Silvanus) on Paul's 2nd missionary journey in the spring of AD 50
 - Date varies Early AD 50s (within 20 years of Christ's resurrection)
- After their imprisonment and release in Philippi, Paul and Silas traveled along the Egnatian Way about 100 miles to the next major city, Thessalonica.
- Luke and Timothy were left behind in Philippi to establish the infant church there.
- Timothy later rejoined Paul and Silas in Berea (Acts 17:10-14)









Occasion - 1 Thessalonians


- When the apostle Paul, accompanied by Silas, entered Thessalonica, their ministry was probably the first gospel witness ever given there (Acts 17:1-9)
- Paul reasoned with the people for 3 Sabbaths
- Paul emphasized 3 points...

PAST

1. The Messiah of the Old Testament had to suffer and rise again from the dead (Acts 17:3)

PRESENT FUTURE 2. Jesus is the promised Messiah (Acts 17:3)

- 3. Jesus is the King who will return to earth to reign (Acts 17:7)
- In a few short weeks, a small group of Thessalonians came to know Jesus Christ as their Savior.





Occasion - 1 Thessalonians

- Because of Paul's success, the Jews were moved to jealousy and gathered a group of thugs from the marketplace to set the city in an uproar.
- When they discovered that Paul and Silas were at the home of Jason, they dragged Jason and some of the other believers before the ruling body (politarchs) of the city.
- The rulers made Jason and the others post a bond and release them. The bond may have included the assurance that Paul and Silas would leave town and not return.
- Paul and Silas left the city that night, realizing their presence was causing added affliction for the believers.
- Their next stop was fifty miles south on the Egnatian Way in Berea (Acts 17:10)
- Once again they encountered opposition when some antagonistic Jews from Thessalonica heard about Paul's preaching, came to Berea, and incited the people to run Paul out of their city.










Occasion - 1 Thessalonians

- After leaving Berea, Paul traveled alone to Athens (Acts 17:16-34), and then on to Corinth.
- He was deeply concerned about the plight of the new believers in Thessalonica, so he sent Timothy there to check on their welfare.
- Some months later Timothy and Silas rejoined Paul in Corinth, bringing him news of conditions in the Thessalonian church (Acts 18:5; 1 Thessalonians 3:1-6).
- From this series of events we can construct the background of the epistle - NEXT SLIDE










- **Purpose** Purpose of The 1st Epistle to Thessalonians
 - Why was this book written to the original audience?
 - Paul wrote this letter with three key purposes...
 - 1. Express his thanks to God for them (1:2; 2:13; 3:9)
 - **2. Explain** why he had not yet visited them again (2:17-18)
 - **3. Correct** doctrinal (3:10; 4:13; 5:1-11) and practical (4:1-12; 5:12-18) problems.












- Theme What is the major emphasis of the First Epistle?
 - Although Paul was in Thessalonica only a short time, yet he touched on many of the great doctrines of the church.
 - Among them was the second coming of Christ. This
 theme was not above the heads of the new
 converts, according to the great apostle.
 - The particular phase in the second coming of Christ which he emphasized was Christ's coming for believers - the Rapture.
 - The second coming of Christ in relationship to believers is a comfort (1 Thessalonians 4:18).
 - The rapture is also referred to as the Blessed Hope! (Titus 2:11-13).


- ❖ In light of Christ's coming , the saints are to be alert and sober (5:6).
- ❖ Paul warns them to abstain from every form of evil (5:22).
- ❖ Paul's final wish was for God to sanctify them entirely and make them without blame at the coming of Jesus (5:23).











Occasion - 2 Thessalonians

- While still at Corinth, shortly after writing 1
 Thessalonians, Paul received more news regarding the condition of the church at Thessalonica.
- With Silas and Timothy at his side, Paul wrote the 2nd letter to the church probably about 2-3 months after 1 Thessalonians was written.
- The occasion for 2 Thessalonians was the receipt of the news that the Thessalonians had received a spurious letter, apparently an intentional forgery, teaching them that they were already in the day of the Lord and its awful judgments.
- The background of both Thessalonian epistles indicates that the church was going through a terrible time of persecution and hardship.
- In the midst of these trials, they began to wonder if they were in the day of the Lord, a period described at great length in the OT and concerning which Paul had taught them, both when he was with them and in writing 1 Thessalonians 5.








Occasion - 2 Thessalonians


- The beginning of this period of tremendous trouble and conflict in the world is identified with great judgments that will be poured out on the world before the 2nd coming of Christ.
- The Thessalonians, on the basis of the forged letter, wondered if they were in this time of trouble, in contradiction to Paul's teaching that the church would be translated before the day of the Lord began (1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:9).
- Paul penned this letter to correct this error.
- Paul's answer, in a word, was that this predicted time of trouble which begins the day of the Lord was still future.
- The persecutions they were undergoing were the normal persecutions that may be experienced by all Christians throughout the church age.








- **Purpose** Purpose of The 2nd Epistle to the Thessalonians
 - The primary purpose for this epistle was to correct a wrong understanding concerning the day of the Lord.
 - Some false teachers had produced spurious information to the effect that Paul had said the day of the Lord was present (2:1).
 - Since the church at Thessalonica was undergoing severe persecution, this appeared to be a logical conclusion (1 Thessalonians 1:6; 2:14; 3:3).
 - The second purpose was to comfort and encourage the Thessalonian believers to remain steadfast under persecution (1:4-12).
 - A third purpose was to correct disorderliness in the church. Some believed they could leave their jobs because the coming of the Lord was so near (3:6-16).










 - 3. Prayer for peace (3:16-17)







