



Truths & Principles

- ✓ Scripture is our source for knowing God's will for our lives - including sanctification and purity.
- ✓ We are commanded to love one another by our Lord – it is not a suggestion. We need the Agape love of God to love even the unlovely.
- ✓ Faithful obedience to God is one way believers gain the respect of unbelievers.



Applications

- ✓ We need the Holy Spirit to control our every thought, word and action.
- ✓ We should worry less about temporal things and be concerned more about what kind of people we are - character matters.
- ✓ Make it your priority to love others, in tangible ways - even the unlovely.
- ✓ Live as Christ would want you to live knowing that for some unbelievers you are the only Bible they will ever read.
